First Meditation: Demolition

- "I need to demolish everything completely and start again from the foundations".
- "I should withhold assent from all propositions that are not completely certain."

Sensory Knowledge

 "What I have accepted until now has come through the senses. But the senses have sometimes deceived me, and it is unwise to trust those who have deceived us."

The Argument from Deception

- I. The senses sometimes deceive me.
- 2. If the senses sometimes deceive me, sensory beliefs aren't knowledge.

3. Sensory beliefs aren't knowledge.

Reply I: Sensory Deception is Limited


 "Yet although the senses occasionally deceive us with respect to objects which are very small or in the distance, there are many other beliefs about which doubt is quite impossible, even though they are derived from the senses—for example, that I am here, sitting by the fire, wearing a winter dressing- gown, holding this piece of paper in my hands, and so on."



Dreaming

- "In my dreams I am often convinced that I am sitting by the few when in fact I am lying in bed."
- "There is never any reliable way of distinguishing being awake from being asleep."

The Argument from Dreaming

- 1. I can't distinguish waking from dreaming.
- 2. If I can't distinguish waking from dreaming, I don't know I'm not dreaming.
- 3. If I don't know I'm not dreaming, my sensory beliefs aren't knowledge.

4. My sensory beliefs aren't knowledge.

Arithmetic and Geometry

- "Physics and astronomy are doubtful, but arithmetic and geometry are secure.
 Whether I am awake or asleep, two plus three makes five."
- But: couldn't an all-powerful God make me go wrong even about that?

 "Suppose that a malicious, powerful, cunning demon has done all that he can to deceive me. All external things are merely dreams that the demon has contrived."


















Second Meditation: Foundation

 My senses and memory may completely deceive me. Is there anything of which I'm certain?

Existence

- Perhaps I can be certain of my own existence?
- Even if I'm doubting all other beliefs if I
 am doubting, then I certainly exist.
- The proposition "I am, I exist" must be true whenever I assert or think it.




Cogito Ergo Sum


- In the Latin: cogito, ergo sum.
- In French: Je pense, donc je suis.
- In English: I think, therefore I am.

Cogito Argument


- I. I'm certain that I'm thinking.
- 2. If I'm thinking, then I exist.

3. I'm certain that I exist.









What am I?

- I can doubt what I perceive.
- I can doubt that I have a body.
- But I can't doubt that I am thinking.
- So I am, essentially, a thing that thinks.
